SANTA BARBARA, CA, December 21, 2017 – Domestic Violence Solutions (DVS) is thrilled to be the recipient of a generous \$1,000 contribution from the CoastHills Credit Union. The funding will help





provide vital services for the women, men and children in the Santa Maria and Lompoc shelters.

The donation was made possible by CoastHills's incredible "I'm All In" program, which launched in December 2015. CoastHills employees can choose to donate a portion of each paycheck to a giving pool. Every quarter, an employee's name is randomly selected, and that employee chooses a nonprofit to receive a \$1,000 grant.

Joshua D. Scroggin, Social Media Officer at CoastHills, explains: "the most novel aspects of

the program are that it is 100% employee funded through 100% percent voluntary donations, and our staff is really deciding where they want to make a difference. The Credit Union's vision statement is 'We make a difference in our neighbors' lives,' and our employees truly live that vision. We now have 98% participation in 'I'm All In,' and

She told me she has seen family members as well as members of the community become victims, and it's a cause she believes is deserving of increased awareness and support."

Last year alone DVS provided 4,687 safe nights to victims and their families. The safety and comfort of residents at DVS depend on the support of outside organizations.
